### Easy and low-cost ways to reduce draughts include:

- 1. Close the doors of rooms you don't use.
- 2. Close curtains and blinds at dusk, even in rooms you're not using.
- 3. If you have long curtains over a radiator, shorten the curtains or tuck the curtains behind the radiator (so as not to heat the window).
- 4. Put foil behind your radiators to reflect the heat back into the room.
- 5. Prevent draughts through letter boxes by fitting a cover/brush, and through keyholes by fitting a keyhole cover.
- 6. Use a door stop draught excluder.

## Other things to consider

- 1. Hang a curtain over external doors.
- 2. Add thermal liners to curtains.
- 3. Flush out radiators that aren't working properly.
- 4. Draught proof doors by fitting draught seals.
- 5. Lag hot water tanks and water pipes.
- 6. Upgrade windows with secondary glazing film that tightens over the pane when heated with a hairdryer, or install magnetic-strip secondary glazing.
- 7. Insulate your loft hatch.
- 8. Insulate your loft or top up the existing insulation. It should be a minimum 270mm.

## More expensive options

- 1. Upgrade your windows to double or triple glazing.
- 2. Install or top up cavity wall insulation.
- 3. Install solid wall insulation if your property was built before the 1920s.

### **ADDITIONAL SUPPORT**

#### **Warm Homes Grant**

Grants to help insulate and make your property more energy efficient are available if you're a home owner or private tenant **without mains gas central heating** and:

- the total gross income (from all sources excluding some benefits) of everyone in the property is under £36,000
- if your home has an EPC rating of D, E, F or G.

Landlords whose tenants qualify for support can receive up to two-thirds subsidy of costs for improvement work, if they own fewer than five rental properties
